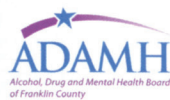

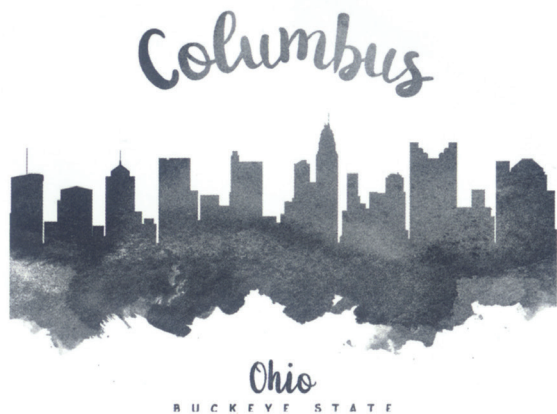

## Opiate Crisis in Franklin County Ohio

- Unintentional drug poisoning became the leading cause of injury death in Ohio, surpassing motor vehicle crashes for the first time on record.
- Franklin County's death rate due to unintentional drug poisoning increase in deaths has been driven largely by opiod-related overdoses.
- Major emphasis in preventing opiate abuse and addiction thus reducing the number of opiate-related deaths.
- Building relationships with the opiate community so when there is a crisis, the Opiate Community Connection is readily available.
- Expanding areas for treatment and prevention.
